Addressing Opioid Use Disorder

Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) is a chronic, life-threatening condition much like high blood pressure and diabetes.

Treating this condition requires long-term management, involving various specialized services.

About OUD:

- OUD is a severe medical condition that has a lasting impact on a person's health. It involves a pattern of opioid use leading to significant impairment or distress, thereby affecting the overall well-being of an individual.
- OUD requires constant medical attention and a personalized treatment plan, just like other chronic diseases such as diabetes. Without continuous care, the risk of serious health issues increases dramatically.
- The management of OUD isn't a one-size-fits-all situation. It calls for the dedication and expertise of skilled healthcare professionals who understand the complexities of the disorder and can effectively manage and treat it, taking into account the individual's specific symptoms, circumstances, and health needs.

Next Steps to Personalized Care

Our Opioid Treatment Program (OTP) is an inclusive approach to help individuals overcome opioid use disorder.

We bring together medication, counseling, and support from the community to provide a comprehensive plan towards recovery.

What to Expect:

- Our program is centered around Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD). This method combines dispensed medicines with counseling and behavioral therapies to treat opioid use disorder, aiming for long-term recovery.
- Our approach is backed by research that indicates the successful recovery rate increases when individuals incorporate dispensed medications into their recovery plan.
- We utilize two main medications - methadone and buprenorphine. These are used to manage withdrawal symptoms safely, control cravings, and prevent relapse, helping individuals on their path to recovery.
- OTP involves various healthcare professionals, including physicians, nurses, and counselors, who work together to provide counseling and medication. Their goal is to restore hope and health to those grappling with opioid use disorder.

How to Get Started

Becoming a part of our OTP is based on an individual assessment that considers opioid use history, among other factors.

- OTP eligibility is not universal. It's based on an individual's specific situation, including their history of opioid use. Other factors may also come into play when determining eligibility.
